The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) propose that every institution aspiring for accreditation should establish an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a quality sustenance measure. Since quality enhancement is a continuous process, the IQAC will become a part of the institution's system and work towards realisation of the goals of quality enhancement and sustenance. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the College is functioning very effectively. 11. We submitted Self Study Report (SSR) for NAAC Accreditation on January 7, 2022.

### **DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS**

On June 1st, 2021, the Department began its activities. Classes for Semester 4 and Semester 2 commenced on the very first day of the academic year through online. In the after-noon, there was an online staff meeting to discuss various academic programmes that are to be organised during the academic year 2021-2022.

We had 55.55 percent result with Four A Grades for the sixth semester. As the faculty members were very actively involved in NAAC Accreditation SSR preparation, the formal inauguration of the Economics Association 'ECONOMICAS' was conducted little bit late. The formal inauguration of the activities of the Economic Association was done by Dr. SanathananVelluva, former HOD of Economics and present Academic Co-ordinator (SFS), St. Joseph's College, Devagiri, Kozhikode on 17<sup>th</sup> February, 2022. He has presented a Webinar on "Career Enrichment Plan". A large number of students from various colleges attended the programme.

A number of students from the Department represented the College for University competitions in Hand Ball and Basket-Ball. A student from S6 got admission for post graduation at East London University and also got placement at Heathrow Airport, London.

The Department conducted staff meetings regularly and evaluated the performance of students. The faculty members have very effectively given mentoring and completed Mentees' Chronicle.

The Department organised Mar Ivanios Memorial Inter-collegiate Paper presentation and Quiz competitions during 25 and 26 March, 2022.

We received fifteen abstracts from various Colleges for paper presentation competition. After careful scrutiny only Nine abstracts were selected for final presentation on 25 March, 2022. Athul Joseph, Dept. of Economics, University of Kerala, RonySabu, Govt. College, Kottayam and Liya Ellen Alex, Bishop Moore College, Mavelikara secured first, second and third prizes respectively. For Mar Ivanios memorial all Kerala Inter-collegiate quiz competition, we received registrations from twenty two colleges. Our hand ball men team participated in south India intercollegiate handball tournament organized by Nazaraeth College, Chennai and secured the best team award.

Our basketball men team secured second runner –up and a cash award of Rs.10000/- in the George Mathew memorial trophy, organized by Providence Engineering College Chengannur.

The department of Physical Education offered “Health and Hygiene” as an open course for the fifth semester students as part of curriculum. In 2020 - 21 academic year, 98 % of the students secured good mark.

### **DEPARTMENT OF LIBRARY**

The college library is partially automated with ILMS software KOHA (version 20.5, Year 2016). Students and staff are permitted to enter the library only after registering their names through the computerized Gate register. Students and faculty have free access to the library facilities from 9 am to 5 pm. The library has a total floor area of 1626\*900 sq.ft. Library has established conducive atmosphere with provision of sufficient tables and chairs for reading within a good ventilated reading room for the students. Different sections are allotted in the library for reference, career guidance, Internet browsing, OPAC, journals, Magazines and newspapers. The reading room is capable for 64 users both teachers and students can be seated at a time. Every year library advisory committee is constituted to strengthen its activity. The library is equipped with seven computers with high-speed broadband connection. The library has a good collection of books, journals, periodicals, newspapers, CD's, e-resources, back volumes of journals and previous year question papers. We have 3644 books, 6000 e-journals, 164300 e-books, 6 printed journals, 201 open access journals, 17 periodicals and 7 newspapers. Documents are classified according to the Dewey Decimal classification and the catalogue search is done through the computerized OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) interface of library management software KOHA. The circulation of books is done using bar-coded ID cards. All books are bar-coded with their accession numbers. When the readers ID card is scanned his/her profile is displayed on the screen and the book is issued by scanning the book barcode. Though it is automated we maintain Brownie charging system is also maintained for circulation. Readers are given 'Reader's ticket' at the time of taking membership and every book has its own card showing the bibliographic details. When a reader comes to take the book, the book card is inserted in his readers ticket and that ticket is filed in the respective due date. When the book is returned the book card is replaced to the book and the user gets the ticket back. The main advantage of this system is that the circulation never stops even if the software crash occurs. The library holds books related to career guidance and competitive examinations and also support students to face various competitive examinations with confidence. The library is Wi-Fi connected. The activities of library related services are available in the institutional website. Open access journals, previous year question papers, E-newspapers, E-encyclopaedia, E-thesis and feedback mechanism are also available in the site. Institutional repositories and previous year question papers are stored in Dspace digital library software. The staff and students are allotted separate ID and passwords for the use of INFLIBNET facility. The registered user can access more than 6000 e-journals and 164300 e-books using N-list of INFLIBNET. The library conducts orientation classes to the users every year to make them aware of various services and e-resources available in the institution. Installation of CCTV in and around the library. The best library user award is constituted to encourage reading habits in students. All matters related to the library are communicated to its users through e-mail and notice board.

### **EXTENSION AND CLUB ACTIVITIES**

It is mandatory for a student to participate in any one of the following Social Service/Extension Activities for not less than forty hours, during the 3rd and 4th semesters, for successful completion of the Programme. General Co ordinator is Ms. Tintu Anna Mohan. The various extension activities offered are National Service Scheme, Literary Club and Environment Club.

#### **1) NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (UNIT No: KL 07-120-A&B)**

The NSS has been introduced in colleges and universities all over India in response to the Kothari Commission's recommendation that education should be oriented to the social needs by involving students in service to the community. There are 2 units with hundred students and they are given training to engage themselves in constructive social action. Certificates are given to volunteers who complete 240 hours of social work during the course of two years. This certificate gives weightage for higher studies and is an additional qualification for appointment in public services.

- The first programme of the academic year started on June 5, World Environment Day, on June 5 observed as a 'dry day'. Dry day was observed by cleaning the houses, and surroundings and remove stagnant water. As part of preventing the spread of epidemics,extensive anti-mosquito and cleaning drives were conducted to arrest the spread of contagious diseases. During the time there were online classes so the volunteers were asked to observe it in their own home and send the photographs to Google class room.
- On 5 June 2021, even though it was a pandemic time our students have grouped into different categories and visited the nearby area to collect the details of the poor and distressed people. It was a great experience for our NSS members there they could see many lives are suffering from various diseases. The main aim of the programme is to identify destitute families and



bring them above the poverty line through various projects at the grassroots level. Our volunteers jointly participated with the nearby Local Self Government Bodies.

- On 13<sup>th</sup> June awareness programme was conducted on 'Prevention of COVID 19- Third Wave'- through online mode by Mrs. Suja P S. The programme was jointly conducted by the District Medical Office, Alappuzha District and NSS Unit, Mar Ivanios College.
- On 3<sup>rd</sup> July, the College NSS Units Celebrated Doctor's Day with an online awareness programme. Dr. Sujith Vijayan Pillai, Hon.MLA, Chavara Constituency, was the Chief Guest.
- On 10<sup>th</sup> July, the College NSS Units observed the World Population Day. Adv. A M Arif, Hon.MP Alappuzha Constituency was the Chief Guest and the programme was conducted on the Topic 'How to Safe Guard the Health and Rights of Women'.
- NSS units in association with college management started the initial work of a fish pond for the implementation of fish farming scheme offered by State Fisheries Department on 24<sup>th</sup> July 2021. The activity was inaugurated by Rev. Fr. Thomas Puthenparampil. Programme Officers, volunteer secretaries and class leaders were present on the occasion.
- One day camps various days were conducted for the construction of fish pond on class wise to meet the COVID 19 protocol.
- The College NSS Units conducted a programme on 7<sup>th</sup> August to commemorate the Hiroshima Day. Class was conducted on the topic- "Lessons from Hiroshima: After Seven Decades" by C G MadhuKavunkal, Notable poet and lyricist. Followed by several cultural programmes which promote peace politics and raise awareness of the effects of the bomb attack on Hiroshima.
- According to the instructions of District Collector, Alappuzha, we have deputed the following NSS volunteers to take part in a 24 hours COVID-19 cell.
  - Panchayath Duty- Libin John Thomas, Lino K Alex
  - Vaccination Duty- Aiswarya V, Lino K Alex

These students are engaged in this duty since April 2021.

- NSS volunteers of our College took part in mobilizing funds for providing mobile phones to help those who face difficulty in participating online classes. The District Administration had called for several number of mobiles phone from the various public sphere. Our NSS volunteers came up with an innovative idea to mobilize fund for this. They had successfully conducting a News Paper Challenge. Through this programme the volunteers managed to mobilize 45000 INR. The volunteers had handed over two mobile phones worth Rs.20000 to the District Administration and through this they could support the marginalized group of students in their studies.

- Our NSS students themselves identified one of the destitute family they were already living with mercy of the community (got financial support for medical treatment for father, mother and one girl child). The elder daughter (Parvathy) in the family is very good at studies and she did not have the facility of mobile phone to access online class, the family cannot afford to buy one. In that situation our volunteers extended their hands to help this family, our volunteers collected money to buy a mobile phone worth Rs.10000 handed over to the girl on 20<sup>th</sup> July 2021.
- NSS volunteers from our College showed their social commitment by providing financial assistance towards treatments for cancer ailments. Volunteers collected an amount of RS 15640, and handed over to the College authorities to help one of our student and NSS volunteer.
- Our volunteers celebrated NSS Day on 24<sup>th</sup> September by organising a programme “CherthunirthamPadheyam”. Our NSS members have made food on their own in our College premise and distributed it to two old age homes (Alphonsa Old Age Home and NethajiSaranalayam, Mavelikara) and one CFLTC, Kandiyoor and the remaining food on the same day they have handed over to the people who live in street. It was a great experience for our volunteers and they actively participated from cooking to distribution.
- On “Gandhi Jayanthi Day” the volunteers gathered at the College and offered Shramdhan and cleaned the road to the College.  
NSS volunteers took the leadership to provide COVID 19 awareness among our students and put posters on each class room regarding the guidelines to COVID -19 protocols. Sanitization of class rooms was done by NSS volunteers daily after the class.
- Two of our volunteers participated in palliative care training at the State Level one 1<sup>st</sup> November 2021.
- One day camp is arranged for cleaning the fish pond on 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2021, this activity marked as a pre arrangement for seeding the fish to the pond.
- Constitution Day was observed on 26<sup>th</sup> November 2021, reading out the preamble of our Indian Constitution. Almost all our volunteers actively participated in this activity.
- On 27<sup>th</sup> November 2021, seeding of fish has done by Rev. Fr.ThomasPutherparampil. Volunteer Secretary Lino K Alex, Palliative Club Secretary Sagar Krishnan Kutty were present at the occasion. From that day to till now, every day the NSS volunteers are feeding the fish without fail.
- Two Volunteer secretaries and Palliative Club convenor participated in the 7 Days Volunteer Leadership Training Camp at University level from 15<sup>th</sup> December 2021 to 21<sup>st</sup> December 2021.

- The NSS units of Mar Ivanios College of Arts and Science conducted our 7 Day Special Camp (hybrid form) from 23<sup>rd</sup> December 2021 -29<sup>th</sup> December 2021. The theme for the camp was “Youth for Prevention and Mitigation of COVID-19. The camp, named ‘Aarjjavam’ was inaugurated by Shri. M. S Arunkumar, MLA, Mavelikara. Our 97 volunteers actively participated in the camp both online and offline. Online sessions were conducted through Google platform. They planted saplings at their premises, conducted a survey, activities were enriched with cultural nights. The highlights of the camp were Motivation and Training classes lead by Sri. Brahmanayakam Mahadevan (NSS trainer and Motivation speaker) and Sri Santo Sebastian (Best NSS volunteer award winner at university level and former student of the college) conducted on 27<sup>th</sup> December 2021 and 24<sup>th</sup> December 2021 respectively. The closing ceremony of the camp was inaugurated by Sri S. S. Biju (Music Director) on 29<sup>th</sup> December 2021.
