DEPARTMENT OF LIBRARY

The college library is a treasure house of information, inspiration, and recreation. The library has at present a collection of over 3308 books, 8 subject journals,201 online journals,11 general periodicals, 6 news papers, previous question papers, Institutional repositories and CD collections.

Layout of the Library:

Library has separate newspaper reading area, periodical section, journal section, reference area, GK & Career related area, internet browsing area, circulation desk and general stack room.

Books are arranged subject wise and separate space allocated for each subject departments.

We have a digital library with 5 terminals, two scanner and internet connection. We are providing this facility to all our students free of cost and it is fully utilized by our students.

Library hours:

The college library normally remains open from 9 am to 5 pm on all working days. **Classification system:**

We are following Dewey Decimal Classification system.(DDC23rd ed.)

Borrowing privileges:

All students and staff of the college are members of the library. Teaching faculty members are allowed to borrow a maximum of 5 books and students are allowed to borrow a maximum of 2 books.

Circulation policies :

•The library has a self-issuing system.

•Loan period: 14 days for students and 21 days for staff.

Library automation:

Library is automated since the academic year 2016-17. We are using the ILMS software KOHA.

KOHA OPAC:

KOHA OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) is the interface for library users. One terminal is reserved for students to search information of availability of documents in the library.

Issue Return process:

Issue, return process is fully automated and manual cards are kept as supporting documents for students and faculty.

Bar-coding:

Book issue and return is carried out with the help of barcode system. Each book and user's borrower card is bar-coded.

Details about books and members:

Details about books and members are created in the Koha software.

Koha Gate Entry:

Koha 'IN OUT Management system' is designed in php framework which works along with Koha software. This Koha plug-in is used to track user entry time and exit time in a particular location of library. It generates various types of reports as per requirement.

D-Space:

College library also has the 'D-Space' Digital library software which is open source software. It has been installed in the college library to organize, manage and provide an access to the institutional repositories and other digital collection of the

library; wherein Ph.D Thesis of the faculty members, college magazine etc. have been stored and made accessible to the end users.

Micas Digital Library:

We are providing a digital library link in the college website for the effective and efficient access to e-resources.

N-list membership :

The college is registered under N list programme and hence entitled to access the e-resources (6000+ e-journals and 1,64,300+ e-books). N list has a user id and password protected access.

EXTENSION AND CLUB ACTIVITIES

It is mandatory for a student to participate in any one of the following Social Service/Extension Activities for not less than forty hours, during the 3rd and 4th semesters, for successful completion of the Programme. General Co ordinator is Ms. Tintu Anna Mohan. The various extension activities offered are National Service Scheme, Literary Club and Environment Club.

1) NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (UNIT No: KL 07-120-A&B)

The NSS has been introduced in colleges and universities all over India in response to the Kothari Commission's recommendation that education should be oriented to the social needs by involving students in service to the community. There are 2 units with hundred students and they are given training to engage themselves in constructive social action. Certificates are given to volunteers who complete 240 hours of social work during the course of two years. This certificate gives weightage for higher studies and is an additional qualification for appointment in public services.

- During the COVID-19 pandemic situation our NSS activities were also shrank to the digital world. But still our NSS volunteers try their best to mitigate the pandemic situation by distributing clothe masks stitched by them. It was a great opportunity for the students to be a part of "break the chain" campaign even in the lockdown period.
- Most of our volunteers have received IGOT COVID-19 training certificate. The IGOT platform can be useful for all front line activists to equip COVID-19 and deal with epidemics.
