The college library is partially automated with ILMS software KOHA Students and staff are permitted to enter the library only after registering their names through the computerized Gate register. The reading room is capable for 64 users both teachers and students can be seated at a time. We are arranged a property counter for the members to store their personal belongings at the entrance of the library. The library is equipped with seven computers with high speed broadband connection. The library has a good collection of books, journals, periodicals, newspapers, CD's, e-resources, back volumes of journals project works and previous year question papers. We have 7070 books 6000 e-journals 199500 e- books, 19 periodicals and 7 newspapers. Documents are classified according to the Dewey decimal classification and the catalogue search is done through the computerized OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) interface of library management software KOHA. The circulation of books is done using bar-coded ID cards. All books are bar-coded with their accession numbers. The library is Wi-Fi connected. Previous year question papers are available in our website. Institutional repositories and previous year question papers are stored in D space digital library software. The staff and students are allotted separate ID and password for the use of INFLIBNET facility. Every year Library Advisory Committee is constituted to strengthen its activity. With a mission to enhance student employability, bridge the gap between academic learning and industry standards, and foster meaningful collaborations, Mr. Anishkumar's initiatives have had a significant impact on students' career development and their exposure to the tech industry. This report outlines the efforts and outcomes of the Placement and ICT Cell initiatives, highlighting the notable programs that have taken place and the resulting improvements in student placements and industry engagement.
