Servant of God Archbishop Mar Ivanios

An Educationist Par Excellence

Servant of God Mar Ivanios is held in deep reverence for his devotion to God and man. He is a blessed soul who has inspired thousands through his prayer life, charismatic personality, broad vision, ascetic ministry, and untiring efforts for peace and human well-being.

Mar Ivanios was born in Mavelikara, Kerala on 21 September, 1882. He took his MA Degree from Madras Christian College in 1907. This won him the familiar appellation 'M.A. Achen' as he was the first to achieve this qualification among the clergy from the Syrian Orthodox fold.

During the period 1913-1919 he occupied, on invitation, the coveted Chairs of Professor of Economics and Syriac in Serampore University College, Calcutta. In recognition of his scholarship, he was appointed the Chairman of the Board of Studies for Eastern Languages of the University for a Long Spell. His commitment to the cause of women's education is evidenced by the provision he gained at Diocesan College, Calcutta to admit female students from Kerala. On 1 May, 1925 he was consecrated Bishop.

As entrusted by the Synod of the Malankara Church held at Mavelikara in 1926 he took the initiative for the Communion of the Malankara Church with the Universal Catholic Church. But the Synod backtracked from the decision later. Responding positively to the call of the Holy Spirit, Mar Ivanios, with his followers, came into Communion with the Universal Catholic Church on 20 September, 1930. Mar Ivanios is rightly revered as the Prophet of Unity. Convinced of the fact that the empowering of people is possible only through education, he established several educational institutions including Mar Ivanios College, Trivandrum. This clearly reveals his futuristic vision on higher education.

On 15 July 1953 he was called to eternal rest. Thousands of people hail him as a Saint. On 15 July, 2007 the Holy Episcopal Synod of the Malankara Catholic Church declared him the Servant of God.

12. COLLEGE RULES

12.1 <u>GENERAL DISCIPLINE</u>

- All students are responsible to the Principal/HODs for their conduct both in and out of the college.
- > They shall respect all the teachers and greet them when they meet for the first time each day either on the campus or outside.
- > When a teacher or a visitor enters the classroom the students should stand up and remain so until they are permitted to sit.
- Students should not enter or leave classrooms without permission. They shall not enter other classes without permission.
- During free hours students are expected to make use of the library. No one should be found loitering on the veranda disturbing other classes.

- They shall not deface the college walls and furniture by writing, engraving, stamping, pasting etc. Everyone shall consider and handle the college property and library books as their own.
- Students are forbidden to organize or attend any meeting on the campus without the prior permission of the Principal. They are not allowed to address the college authorities in a group; such action is subversive. Written sanction of the principal is necessary to collect any fund or to circulate notice or petition of any kind by any student either on the campus or outside.
- > Students are requested to wear duly signed identity cards and show it whenever authorities demand them.
- Any student who is persistently insubordinate, willfully mischievous and who is likely to have an unwholesome influence on fellow students may be removed from the rolls.
- ➤ The students are free to consult the Principal on any matter of college discipline, academic performance, co-curricular activities etc. On any matter of dispute, the decision of the Principal shall be final.
- Smoking which is injurious to health is strictly prohibited inside the college campus and those consuming intoxicants of any type will be expelled.
- > Political activism is strictly banned inside the campus. Students are forbidden to organize or attend meetings other than the official ones. Students resorting to strikes are strictly prohibited from entering the veranda of the building or the classroom.
- All UG students should come to college wearing the official college uniform on all working days except on Wednesday.

12.2 ETHICS AND ETIQUETTE

- **Punctuality:** Students are required to reach the college in time. College timing is from 9.30 am to 3.30 pm and the first bell is at 9.20 am and second bell at 9.25 am followed by prayers, pledge etc.
- **Sincerity:** Attend every class with genuine interest and wholehearted co-operation.
- **Cleanliness:** Cleanliness is next to Godliness. Keep the campus clean. Don't throw any waste materials on the floor or ground but shall drop them in the dustbins kept for the purpose.
- **Discipline:** After the second bell in the morning, turn up for the assembly. If there is no assembly every student must be in the class room. Standing on the 'Veranda' is not allowed. Observe silence during prayer and participate in the pledge. Keep silence in the library. Learn to give respect and take respect.
- **Dressing:** Keep modesty in dressing. For Boys collarless T shirts and for girls short skirts and tight dresses are not allowed.
- **Etiquette:** Decent behavior is expected in bus and other vehicles. Any complaint of misbehavior will be seriously dealt with. Vulgar comments on the opposite sex will invite serious actions. Wandering inside the campus is prohibited. Take care to use decent language only.
- **General code of conduct:** Use English for communication. Utilize library during lunch break and free hours. Actively participate in the extra-curricular activities like NSS, Clubs, Subject Associations etc.
- **ID Badges:** It is mandatory for all the students to wear the ID Badges on the campus.
- Smoking and use of intoxicants like drugs, liquor, pan masala etc. strictly banned. Anybody violating this has to face serious consequences.

12.3 MOBILE PHONE

Government had banned the use of mobile phones in College campus Vide G. O. No. RT/No.346/05, Higher Education dated 1/3/2005. The College Council, the PTA General Body & the PTA Executive have discussed the matter seriously and decided to enforce it strictly for the good of the student community. The Ethics Committee worked out the details of the enforcement and the following decisions were taken.

- Students are not allowed to bring or use mobile phones on the campus, including classrooms and library.
- Strict disciplinary action will be taken against those who violate the instruction.
- If any student is found with mobile phone in hand or using it without permission, it shall be reported to the department concerned.
- All the teachers are authorized to report the same to the department concerned.
- A fine of Rs. 100/- will be charged as penalty and the parents can claim the phone equipment from the Principal.
- If repeated by the same students, the equipment will be withheld by the Principal. She/he can claim it along with caution deposit at the end of the course.

* <u>TWO WHEELERS PARKING</u>

Motor bikes, bicycles, etc. Park in the area marked for the purpose near the main gate. As per the direction of the Govt. of Kerala no. 26483/G1/15/H. Edn, no type of vehicles should be used during celebrations inside the campus. The whole-hearted co-operation of the students, teachers, non-teaching staff, parents and all other well-wishers of our college are solicited for the smooth running of the college.

13. LIBRARY

Library is the nerve centre of all academic activities of the college. It provides a place where teachers and students can pursue research and study unhampered by noise or any other disturbance. Its facilities and services exist solely to cater to the needs of the academic community of the college. To ensure maximum benefits to those who use the library, certain regulations are laid down. It is to be observed by all those who want to make use of the library.

a. The College Library normally remains open from 9.00 am to 5.pm on all working days.

b. Members of the staff and students of the college are members of the library.

c. Students should submit their identity cards at the counter before entering the library.

d. Strict silence must be maintained in the library.

e. No books or periodicals shall be removed from the library unless it is registered at the issuing counter.

f. Borrowed books must be returned within a fortnight and they can be re-issued for a further period of 15 days, if no one else has applied for the book. A book may be recalled at any time even before the expiry of the period.

g. Members are expected to use books with care. If a book is lost or damaged, it should be replaced at once together with fine. If the book is not replaced, the defaulter shall pay.

h. Two times the cost of the book together with fine. Students are not allowed to pass on the books from one to another or to lend them to any one in or out of the college.

i. Books lost, damaged or defaced must be paid for by the student in whose name they were issued.

j. All books must be returned by due date. An overdue fine of Rs. 7/- per week will be imposed on all books not returned on time.

k. Students are liable to forfeit their membership of the library for disregard of the library rules, indiscipline or misbehavior

<u>13.1 MICAS DIGITAL LIBRARY:-</u> (Mar Ivanios College of Arts and Science Digital Library)

To provide effective and efficient access to e – resources a digital and e – library is functioning, anyone who has digital access can avail this facility, by *'micasdigitallibrary.in.*

On August 20, 2020, we secured N-LIST (National Library and Information Services) membership; it provides access to more than 6000+ e-journals, 164300+ e-books through N–LIST and 6,00,000 e-books through NDL (National Digital Library). All students and faculty members can access it from <u>https://nlist.inflibnet.ac.in</u> using a unique username and password provided to each user.

It will be on the parliamentary mode and as per the Lyngdoh Committee report, approved by the Honorable Supreme Court of India. In the parliamentary mode, the elected / nominated representatives from each class constitute the Parliament. There will be two representatives from each class a boy and a girl. The Union Executive consisting of the **Chairman, Vice Chairman, General Secretary, Arts Club Secretary, Student Editor and a University Union Councilor** will be elected by the Parliament from among the members. The Principal shall be the ex-officio Patron of the Parliament and the Union Executive. The Moderator of the Parliament will be the Dean of the student affairs. There will be staff advisors to the Union Executive.

The Union Executive shall be accountable to the staff council and to the Parliament. All the students are members of the College Union.

15. EVALUATION AND GRADING -CBCSS

The Evaluation of each Course shall consists of two parts Continuous Evaluation (CE)

End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

The CE and ESE ratio shall be 1:4 for both Courses with or without practical. There shall be a maximum of 80 marks for ESE and maximum of 20 marks for CE.

A maximum 20 marks for CE is calculated in accordance with three factors in each Course.

1) Attendance (Max. marks 5):

2) Assignments or Seminars: (Max. marks 5)

3) Tests: (Max. marks 10)

The allotment of marks for attendance for each course is as given below.

15.1. ATTENDANCE

Students who secure above a minimum of 50% attendance in all the Courses and a minimum of 75% attendance in the aggregate for all the Courses of a semester will be allowed to register for End Semester Evaluation. Others have to repeat the semester along with the next batch, unless they could make up the shortage of attendance through condonation. However the award of Grade for attendance in CE shall be made course-wise. Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 10 days in a semester subject to a maximum of two times during the whole period of a Degree Programme shall be granted by the University on valid grounds.

Assignments or Seminars: (Max. marks 5)

Assignments/Seminars shall be evaluated on the basis of their quality. The teacher shall define the expected quality of an assignment in terms of structure, content, presentation etc. and inform the same to the students. Due weight shall be given for punctuality in submission. Seminar shall be similarly evaluated in terms of structure, content, presentation, interaction etc.

Tests: (Max. marks 10)

For each Course there shall be at least one internal exam (model) during a semester.

From 2020 - 21 admission onwards the marks allocated to attendance is re allocated to assignment. But the students should secure a minimum of 75% attendance in aggregate for all the courses of a semester taken together is allowed to register for End Semester Evaluation.

On the successful completion of the Course, Grades are given to the students on a 7-point scale based on the total percentage of mark scored (CE+ESE).

15.3 <u>CBCSS AN OVER VIEW – SEMESTER SYSTEM AT A GLANCE</u>

Definitions

'Academic Programme' means the entire Course of study as per the given Scheme and Examinations.

'Semester' means a term consisting of a minimum of 90 working days distributed over a minimum period of 18 weeks.

'Course' means a portion of a subject to be taught and evaluated in a semester (similar to a paper under annual scheme).

'Language Courses' are Courses in English and an Additional Language of student's choice, for which all the students who join for First Degree Programmes have to register.

'Foundation Course' means a Course at the foundation level that all students of the First Degree Programme have to register.

'Core Course' means a compulsory Course in a Major Subject related to the First Degree Programme in a discipline.

'Complementary Course' means a Course in a subject other than the Major Subject and is complementary to it.

'Open Course' means an Optional Course which the student is free to take at his/her will. Open Course shall be a Non-Major Elective Course offered by the Departments other than the Parent Department.

'Vocational Course' is a Compulsory course in a Major Subject of schedule 2 (a).

'Audit Course' means a Course which the student can register without earning Credits (Zero Credit Courses) and are not compulsory for completing the Degree Programme.

"Elective Course" means a Specialized Course from the frontier area of the Core Subject, offered by the Parent Department which he/she is free to choose.

'Repeat Course' is a Course that a student repeats if he/she has failed in it.

'Credit' (C) of a Course is a measure of the weekly unit of work involving lecture or laboratory session or seminar or similar activity assigned to for the Course.

'Grade' indicates the level of performance of a student in a Course.

'Grade Point' is an integer indicating the numerical equivalent of the broad level of performance of a student in a Course. The product of Grade Point and the Credit of a Course is called 'Credit Point'.

'Semester Credit Point Average' (SCPA) is an index of the overall performance of a student at the end of a semester. It is obtained by dividing the sum of the Credit Points Obtained by a student at the end of a semester by the sum of the Credits of Courses taken by the student in the semester.

'Cumulative Credit Point Average' (CCPA) indicates the broad academic level of performance of the student in a Programme. It is obtained by dividing the sum of the Credit Points in all the Courses taken by the student for the entire Programme by the total number of Credits.

'Major Subject' means the subject for which the student has chosen the Core Courses in the respective Programme.

'Faculty Advisor' means a teacher appointed by the Department Council/ HOD who will advise the student on all academic matters. The teacher will be from the Department of the Major Subject.

'Grace Marks' means marks awarded to a student in recognition of meritorious achievements in Sports/Arts/ NCC/NSS.
